Mark 9:2-13

² After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. ³ His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. ⁴ And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus. ⁵ Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters - one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." ⁶ (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.) ⁷ Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!" ⁸ Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus. ⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. ¹⁰ They kept the matter to themselves, discussing what "rising from the dead" meant. ¹¹ And they asked him, "Why do the teachers of the law say that Elijah must come first?" ¹² Jesus replied, "To be sure, Elijah does come first, and restores all things. Why then is it written that the Son of Man must suffer much and be rejected? ¹³ But I tell you, Elijah has come, and they have done to him everything they wished, just as it is written about him."

FOR REFLECTION:

DAILY DEVOTIONS, REFLECTIONS AND SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS WRITTEN BY REV GAVIN LANDERS

Mark 9:2-13 This passage clarifies what the church is all about. While Peter expresses a desire to cocoon himself into a holy huddle that makes no reference to the outside world (v5), Jesus leads them down the mountain (v9) to heal the sick, save the lost and give themselves away to the world for the benefit of humankind. We as the church have no lesser task. If the church is to be true to its calling and remain relevant and alive, then the safety of the cocoon must necessarily be followed by exposure to the world.



SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS:

1. Share a time in your church experience where you wished you could freeze time and live out that moment forever?
2. Respond to the comment that "To stay cocooned means death for the church." Make some assessment of the church in the light of this statement.
3. What do you think Jesus leading his disciples down the mountain to heal the sick, save the lost and give ourselves away to the world for the benefit of humankind looks like for you as the church today?
