The vine and the branches

15 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ²He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes^[a] so that it will be even more fruitful. ³You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.⁵ 'I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

DAILY DEVOTIONS, REFLECTIONS AND SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS WRITTEN BY TONY MATHEE

There are really many, many meaningful truths and lessons that we can learn from this reading. What follows are just a few poignant thoughts.



In our lives we can do many meaningless and self-fulfilling activities. However, the problem arises when we think we can successfully perform spiritual endeavours on our own, thinking that the Church can greatly benefit from our vast experience and expertise. Jesus says, "Without me you can do nothing". If we truly want to do something worthwhile for the Kingdom of God, we, as the branches need to be joined to the vine which is Jesus. And how do we abide in the vine? By prayer and regularly reading His Word the Bible. Get your sustenance from Jesus and the Holy Spirit within you.

But what is the fruit that the branches produce? An interesting thought that occurred to me was that the fruit in no way benefits the branch. Others inside and outside the Church benefit from the fruit. Fruit is often thought of as soul winning, but it is much, much more. All the 9 fruit of the Spirit and the many gifts of the Holy Spirit can greatly benefit others and can be regarded as fruit.

Did you know that without pruning, the vine produces less and less fruit? The unpruned vine will use all its energy to increase its size and foliage. Do you sometimes feel that in your life you are doing more and more and achieving less and less? Is this not food for thought for the willing but over committed servant of the Lord? Pruning a vine is severe. To produce really good grapes a vine is pruned between 85% to 90%. It is a very challenging thought that so much more could be achieved in a Church if many more volunteers came forward and they used the few Spiritual gifts given to them well!!!

SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS:

1. Look at the 9 fruit of the Spirit (Gal.5: 22) and discuss how each one could benefit others.
2. In what way is my life producing fruit that could benefit the Church directly or indirectly?
3. How does prayer and Bible reading enable me to practically be connected to Jesus?
4. How do think the Gardener (God) would do the work of pruning in a person?
5. "Isn't it a bit harsh for God to cut off branches that don't bear fruit?" Discuss.

Pray daily: Set up family time for prayer and devotions and stick to this arrangement. All devotions should always begin by with a prayer. Ask a family member to pray or one of the children.

Scripture Reading: [John 15:1-8](#)

Allow children/teens to read out loud for the family.

Activity/Family Moment:

This scripture is all about staying connect to God.

Ask each other what ways we can connect with God?

Ask what ways do we connect with each other?

Ask if there are other ways that your family wants to be connected to each other. (e.g. family movie nights, eating supper together, go on a family hike, play video games with your children, have dance parties etc.)

Activity: 3-legged race: Pair up and stand next to each other. Tie the inside legs together with a stocking (or something that has given). Race up and down an open area. You can swap partners. If you family is an odd number have a 5-legged race where 3 people team up!

The reason for this activity is to show that to stay connect and achieve your goal you need to work together with others, you also have to put in the effort to stay connected to God

Monday, May 3, 2021: [Psalm 80](#); [Isaiah 5:1-7](#); [Galatians 5:16-26](#)

Memory verse: “But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.” Gal. 5: 22-23
